Evidence-Based Practice in New York State: A Delphi Study

The purposes of this study were to (a) identify barriers to implementing evidence into clinical practice in New York State, (b) prioritize resources needed to address these barriers, and (c) determine how the Cathryne A. Welch Center for Nursing Research (CNR) might provide support to address the identified barriers.

- Accepted for publication in the inaugural edition of the Journal of American Nurses Association of NY (JANANY) due out in January 2021.
- Accepted for presentation as part of the EBP/Technology/Innovation paper session at the Eastern Nursing Research Society (ENRS) Annual Scientific Sessions virtual conference in March 2021.

A Collaborative Leadership Model to Advance Nursing and Health Care in New York State

This presentation illustrates the ways the Center for Nursing at the Foundation of New York State Nurses (CFN) and the <u>American Nurses Association – New York</u> (ANA-NY) developed a collaborative leadership model to achieve mutual goals to advance nursing in New York State. Collective goals include increasing the visibility of the nursing profession, empowering nursing professionals, and improving public health through education, research, and dissemination of best practices.

Economic Impact of the COVID-19 Pandemic on a Subsample of the U.S. Nursing Workforce - Descriptive Study

In collaboration with <u>Nurses House, Inc.</u>, a purposive sample of nurses who experienced financial distress in direct relation to the COVID-19 pandemic was available from nurses who applied to Nurses House for temporary monetary support. Examining the deidentified data obtained from their applications provides interesting descriptive information to increase the understanding of COVID-19's effects on nurses.

- Manuscript being prepared to submit for publication in a notable national nursing journal.
- Plans for a qualitative study to commence exploring the response of nurses who received financial support.



2016-2017 New York State Faculty & Nursing School Capacity Survey

Data collected from nursing programs across New York State in a survey conducted and analyzed in 2018 will be collated and prepared for submission for publication by a PhD student at Pace University. This survey is a replication of a survey that was done by the Foundation of New York State Nurses (FNYSN) in 2010-2011 and results of both surveys have vital implications for nursing education, faculty recruitment, and employment policies.

Oral History Project Highlighting Nurses Impacted by COVID-19

In collaboration with <u>Nurses House</u>, <u>Inc.</u> and <u>NYU Rory Myers College of Nursing</u>, a pilot project is in the planning phase intended to conduct interviews with approximately twenty nurses in New York State who were on the front lines in acute care, long term care, and home care during the global pandemic. The Center for Nursing History (CNH) is dedicated to capturing the stories of nurses and document their experiences for historical purposes as well as for potential research purposes.
