We are thrilled with the progress we have made this year, largely due to the expertise and dedication of many colleagues who have volunteered their time and energy. As a result of this collaboration and hard work, we would like to provide an update on the current projects, publications, and presentations that have been accomplished so far this year:

Clinical and Educational Challenges Implementing Evidence-Based Practice in New York State: A Delphi Study

Our illustrious Center for Nursing Research (CNR) team comprised of volunteer nurse researchers has kept pace analyzing data collected last year that identified challenges of evidence-based practice (EBP) in both the clinical and nursing education settings. The clinical data was published in the [Journal of The American Nurses Association of New York's](#) (JANANY) inaugural Winter 2021 edition. It was also presented at the [Eastern Nursing Research Society's](#) (ENRS) virtual conference in March 2021. The education data will be submitted for publication by the end of the summer and the data obtained from both parts of the study will inform the Center for Nursing Research's strategic plan for 2022.

A Collaborative Leadership Model to Advance Nursing and Health Care in New York State

This presentation, accepted for presentation at the [Sigma Theta Tau 46th Biennial Convention](#) in November 2021, illustrates the ways the Center for Nursing at the Foundation of New York State Nurses (CFN) and the [American Nurses Association – New York](#) (ANA-NY) developed a collaborative leadership model to achieve mutual goals to advance nursing in New York State. Collective goals include increasing the visibility of the nursing profession, empowering nursing professionals, and improving public health through education, research, and dissemination of best practices.



Economic Impact of the COVID-19 Pandemic on a Subsample of the U.S. Nursing Workforce - Descriptive Study

In collaboration with [Nurses House, Inc.](#), a purposive sample of nurses who experienced financial distress in direct relation to the COVID-19 pandemic was available from nurses who applied to Nurses House for temporary monetary support. Examining the de-identified data obtained from their applications provides interesting descriptive information to increase the understanding of COVID-19's effects on nurses. This research was published in the [Online Journal of Issues in Nursing](#) (OJIN) and will be made available to non-ANA members in September 2021. It was also accepted for presentation at the [Sigma Theta Tau](#) 46th Biennial Convention in November 2021.
